

Important Information for Buyers

Registration	All potential buyers must register for the sale prior to placing a bid. Registration information may be submitted in person at our reception desk, by fax to 215.599.2240, or through our website at www.freemansauction.com . We will require proof of identification and residence and may require a credit card and/or a bank reference. By registering for the sale, the buyer acknowledges that he or she has read, understood and accepted Freeman's Terms and Conditions of Sale.
Buyers Premium	For each lot purchased a Buyer's Premium of 25% is payable on the first and including \$20,000, 20% of a successful bid price of \$20,001 to \$500,000 and 12% of all successful bid prices of \$500,001 and above.
Sales Tax	All items in the catalogue are subject to the 8% Pennsylvania and Philadelphia sales tax. Dealers purchasing for resale must register their tax numbers on current PA forms. Forms should be submitted to our Client Services office on the second floor.
Catalogue Descriptions	All item descriptions, dimensions and estimates are provided for guidance only. It is the buyer's responsibility to inspect all lots prior to bidding to ensure that the condition is to their satisfaction. If potential buyers are unable to inspect lots in person, our specialists will be happy to prepare detailed Condition Reports on individual lots as quickly as possible. These are for guidance only, and all lots will be sold "as is" as per our Terms and Conditions of Sale.
Bidding	<p>At the auction, registered bidders will be assigned a bidder number and given a paddle for use at the sale. Once the first bid has been placed, the auctioneer asks for higher bids in increments determined by the auctioneer. To place your bid, simply raise your paddle until the auctioneer acknowledges you. The auctioneer will not mistake a random gesture for a bid.</p> <p>Phone Bidding: A limited number of telephone lines are available for bidding by phone through a Freeman's representative. Phone lines must be reserved in advance. Requests, in writing, must be submitted no later than 24 hours prior to the scheduled start of the sale.</p> <p>Absentee Bidding: Bid forms are available in the sale room and at the back of the catalogue. These should be submitted in person, by mail or by fax no later than one hour prior to the scheduled start of the sale. The auctioneer will bid on your behalf up to the limit indicated, but is not responsible for errors or failure to execute bids.</p> <p>Absentee Bidding via www.freemansauction.com: A fully-illustrated catalogue is available on-line. Registered bidders may leave absentee bids up to two hours prior to the auction through the website and will receive email confirmation of their bid after it has been processed.</p> <p>Live Online Bidding: Bid live via Freeman's Infinite Bidding Powered by Artifact at www.freemansauction.com during our auction. Please pre-register. Upon being approved, you are welcome to watch the auction as it happens and bid with the click of a mouse. Our auctions go live online for bidding at the published start time of the sale. Freeman's is not responsible for errors or failure to execute bids.</p>
Payment	Goods purchased will not be released until we have received full payment. Payment may be made in cash, by check, money order, debit card, or wire transfer. Checks will be verified through Tele-Check Services allowing removal of lots upon receipt of payment. Freeman's requires payment via wire transfer for purchases over \$20,000.00; please contact Client Services for details.
Removal of Purchases	Deliveries will not be made during the time of the sale unless otherwise indicated by the auctioneer. All items must be paid for and removed within 10

days. Purchases not so removed may be turned over to a licensed warehouse at the expense and risk of the purchaser.

Shipping and Packing
