A Chinese "claire de lune" or pale celadon-glazed pouring vessel, Huajiao 粉青釉花浇

Decorated with lobed "chrysanthemum-petals" to shoulder and body, the underside marked "Da Qing Yongzheng Nian Zhi", traces of a dark dressing to the polished footring.

H: 9 3/4 in.

Provenance: Acquired from a New Jersey estate by the present owner.
